


WINTER STAFF PICKS FROM HARPER PERENNIAL



"When 27-year-old Peter Hessler volunteered to be a teacher in the small Chinese town of Fuling, located along the Yangtze River in Sichuan Province, he expected to learn a new language and spend some valuable time in a foreign setting under the auspices of the Peace Corps. What he experienced in those two years-the natural beauty, cultural tension, and complex process of understanding that takes place when one is thrust into a radically different society-is more than anything he could have imagined. Hessler observes firsthand how major events like the death of Deng Xiaoping, the return of Hong Kong to the mainland, and the controversial construction of the Three Gorges Dam have sent tremors large enough to sweep through China and reach the people of Fuling. The book takes place in the 1990s but it's still a very poignant and compelling look at how China is still a country seeking to understand both what it was and what it has become."



The father of five children, Jones lives in Palo Alto, CA, where he is a Scholar in Residence at the Martin Luther King Jr. Research and Education Institute at Stanford.
